Critical Incident Stress Debriefing and Manaagement Overview

This Two-Day Class will prepare participants to understand a wide range of crisis intervention services including pre and post incident crisis education, significant other support services, on-scene support services, crisis intervention for individuals, demobilizations after large-scale traumatic incidents, small group defusings and group interventions known as Critical Incident Stress Debriefing (CISD).

It's hard to imagine that an incident as horrific as those that occurred in Oklahoma City, New York City, The Pentagon, Newtown, Charleston, Orlando and the list goes on and on in our own communities. Though most agencies have trained and equipped their officers for immediate response to mass casualties and other critical incidents such as Officer Involved Shootings, Hostage Situations, Homicide Scenes, Line of Duty Injury and Deaths, Suicides, and Natural Disasters.

The term "debriefing" is widely used and means different thigs. Most forms of debriefing do not equate to the "Critical Incident Stress Debriefing." Critical Incident Stress Debriefing (CISD) is a specific 7-phase, small group, support crisis intervention process. It is just one of the many crisis intervention techniques which are included under the umbrella of a Critical Incident Stress Management (CISM) program. The CISD process DOES NOT constitute any form of psychotherapy and it should never be utilized as a substitute for psychotherapy.



This Two-Day Basic CISM Educational Training with provide the following:

DAY-ONE:

- 1.) Introduction s of Attendees and Definition
- 2.) Describe Critical Incident Stress
- 3.) Describe and discuss the essential concepts in CISD
- 4.) Review the Historical and Theoretical Foundations of CISD
- 5.) Review the required conditions for the application of the CISD Process
- 6.) Discuss and review Stress and Trauma signs and symptoms
- 7.) Describe and Discuss Individual Intervention
- 8.) Describe and Discuss Demobilizations
- 9.) Describe and Discuss Defusing
- 10.) Review and Discuss the seven phases of debriefing

DAY-TWO

11.) Discuss the CISD Team Concept and recuritment of team members

12.) Discuss *Stress* Management and follow-up actions and Review resources that inlude professional counseling, chaplain programs, Post Critical Incident Seminars, EAP referrals, EMDR, and Trauma Reduction Exercises. Discuss Self Care and Compassion Fatigue

- 13.) Overview and Written Test
- 14.) Breakout Role Play Scenarios
- 15.) Evaluation and Certificates of Completion
