Purpose:

The 11th Annual DuPont Rescue Experience will simulate search and rescue operations in a wilderness environment. The Exercise will begin on Friday November 11th at 1800 and will conclude on Sunday November 13th. The exercise will be divided into four (12) hour operational periods and will be managed utilizing the National Incident Management System. Search crews, dog crews, and technical rescue teams are encouraged to participate.

Training:

This year the theme of the exercise is “In the pursuit of excellence”. Training and scenarios all weekend will involve combining knowledge, skills, and abilities to overcome challenges found in the wilderness environment. Training sessions will be held throughout the weekend hosted by DuPont Rescue Experience instructors focusing on search management, technical rope rescue, land navigation, wilderness ems, mountain bikes in SAR, disaster communications, canines in SAR, and incident management. Participants are encouraged to participate in one or more of these training sessions in conjunction with ongoing search exercise operations. Special Training: Advanced High Directionals

This course will present the use of high directionals in rope rescue from intermediate to advanced configurations using modern hardware. The intended audience for this program is rope rescue technicians with 2 or more years field experience with rope rescue instructor preferred. Course will be field based over Friday evening and all day Saturday. Participant equipment required: Helmet, gloves, harness, ascending/descending devices, 5 locking carabiners, 2 sets of prussiks, and any hardware you would like to discuss and use in the operations. Instructors: Bryan Jones Greensboro Fire Department, Bruce Hodges and Shawn Haynes NCOSFM Training specialists. (Limited to 20 participants)



An incident management team made up of participants will coordinate operations for the entire weekend. This will ensure teams are assigned as quickly as possible for field work. There will be opportunities to serve in various positions within the IMT. If you would like to sign up for a position or to shadow the IMT please be sure to indicate this on your registration. If you are working towards having a position task-book signed (PTB) please indicate this on your online registration .

The incident command post will be established at Guion Farm within DuPont State Forest and will be operational 24 hours a day during the event. The intent of this exercise is to provide real world scenarios for the participant, in order to enhance his or her overall operational effectiveness.

Be sure to register early, registration limited to the first 150 participants, those registering before November 1st will receive a long sleeve quick dry t-shirt, shirts can only be guaranteed to those registering early.

Education:

Blue Ridge Community College will issue continuing education credits for training participation at no charge to fire, rescue, emergency medical services, emergency management, or any other agency addressed in a N.C. jurisdictional emergency operations plan. All other participants wishing to receive credits will be charged a \$125 continuing education fee in addition to the exercise registration fee.

Age Requirements:

Accommodations:

A limited amount of primitive camping sites are available at base camp. Requests should be made with registration. Overnight stays on site are not required. Equipment & Logistics:

- **ATV Use:** *ATV use will be limited to Utility Type Vehicles and atvs designated as department response vehicles*, these include, but are not limited to: Gators, Mules, Rangers, Etc. Participants bringing these vehicles will attend a special training topic on Saturday before integrating into operations.
- Each discipline requires certain equipment, be sure to review this list in our Participant Guide located on our website. Each participant is required to bring their own search and rescue equipment.
